If you are enthusiastic about a future career in the hospitality and tourism industry, then start your journey with a Queenstown Resort College (QRC) National Scholarship! QRC will be awarding two National Scholarships; one for the Hospitality Management Diploma and one for the Adventure Tourism Management Diploma.

Our Scholarships financially support students who have a bright future in the tourism industry. Scholarships are awarded on merit as well as a genuine interest in the tourism industry.

## Valuation and duration

The QRC National Scholarships cover the recipient's second year diploma tuition (\$13,312 total value). The first year may be Fees Free for those who qualify under the Government Fees Free Policy.

## What are we looking for?

- Enthusiasm for the industry: the desire to pursue a career in hospitality or adventure tourism.
- Commitment and professionalism: a motivation to succeed academically, be a QRC Ambassador and a leader for our student body.
- Personal excellence: a good academic record and demonstrated achievement in a range of extracurricular, sporting, community and leadership activities.

## Who is eligible?

Scholarships are open to Citizens or Permanent Residents of New Zealand who are beginning their Diploma study with QRC in 2020 at the Queenstown campus.

**All Applications Reviewed**

### **Short List of Applicants**

Five candidates for each Diploma will be short listed for an interview by the Scholarship Panel. The interview will be used to further ascertain the candidate's suitability to the industry and to the College in general.

Candidates will be notified on the **13th September 2019** as to whether their application has been short listed.

### **Applicants Interviewed**

All interviews will be conducted within two weeks of notification. Interviews will be conducted via Skype if outside of the Queenstown region.

## Selection Evaluation

Candidates are evaluated on:

- Academic merit, level of extracurricular involvement, leadership potential, knowledge of the hospitality and tourism industry, curriculum vitae and interview. Creativity and presentation of the submission is also considered.
- The QRC National Scholarship is an ambassador role and therefore the selection panel are looking for candidates who demonstrate strong communication skills, positive and outgoing personalities, enjoy working and being involved and show a strong interest in tourism or hospitality.
- Evidence of reliability, grooming and time management demonstrated via references.
- Service to the community is a highly considered attribute.

## Conditions of Scholarship

- The Scholarship Selection Panel's decision is final and no further correspondence will be entered into.
- The Scholarship is for the Diploma programme commencing in 2020 and is nontransferable.
- To be considered for the Scholarship, applicants must meet entry requirements of QRC Diploma they are applying for, such as being 18 years of age at programme commencement.
- The Scholarship covers 100% of the second year diploma tuition fees. The Scholarship does not include the costs associated with re-sitting any failed papers or cost of living, such as accommodation. College fees are subject to change.
- This is considered an Ambassador role and as such, the successful candidates will have a willingness to participate in future marketing activities that may be requested by the Marketing Department, including signing a photo and video model release form.
- Scholarship funds are directly paid to the QRC Admissions team and credited to fees.
- Successful recipients of the Scholarship must sign and accept the contractual agreements and obligations of the Scholarship. Any withdrawal from the programme prior to completion will require the student to re-pay the Scholarship fees invested by QRC. Dismissal from the programme due to the recipient's non-attendance, under performance and course failure will also result in the financial obligation having to be met by the recipient.

## Expectations of Scholarship Recipient

- Be a responsible member of the QRC community and abide by the regulations of QRC.
- Be an Ambassador for QRC and be actively involved in any promotions, Student Council, Tourism Career Camp and other areas identified by QRC.
- Fulfil the programme requirements (attendance, personal excellence, assignments and examinations) and progress through the Diploma programme in the time allowed.
- Be a leader on campus and report any difficulties in complying to the Scholarship or the Diploma to the Student Relations Manager.
